All shortlisted applicants will be advised of their Early Admission outcomes on 10 October 2022, before the NSW HSC exams commence.

UOW Early Admission is our early offer program for students completing Year 12 (Higher School Certificate or other Australian equivalents) during 2022. When you apply for Early Admission, UOW looks beyond your ATAR and considers your unique skills and experiences, alongside your Year 11 results, so you can earn an offer to uni before you sit your first exam.

Getting into UOW early means less stress for you at that time and provides you with the certainty that next year you'll be studying at a uni who knows you're more than your ATAR.

5 steps for your application

Check your eligibility. If you are studying at an Australian high school, completing the HSC, the International Baccalaureate (IB) or an equivalent, you are eligible to apply

Choose up to two courses

Complete your application online

If you are shortlisted for consideration, you will be invited to attend an interview or online session
Breathe, stress less and focus on your final exams.

University of Sydney New Pharmacy Degrees in 2023

From 2023, the University of Sydney will offer new combined degrees for school leavers who want to study Pharmacy.

You will now gain a Bachelors and Masters degree, as well as completing the intern training program and supervised practice requirements in the same amount of time that would take to complete a standalone undergraduate degree and complete the Pharmacy Board of Australia's requirements.

- [Bachelor of Pharmacy \(Honours\) / Master of Pharmacy Practice](#) (5 years)
- [Bachelor of Pharmacy and Management \(Honours\) / Master of Pharmacy Practice](#) (6 years)

Upon completing one of the combined degrees, you won't need to undertake any further supervised practice after you graduate in order to practise pharmacy. However, you will still need to pass the [Pharmacy Board registration exam](#) to be eligible for general registration.

What it's like to study in the UK as an international student, and how to apply to a UK university.

The UK is one of the world's most popular destinations for international students.

Undergraduate applications to UK universities are usually made through the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS).

Postgraduate applications are normally made direct to the university, usually via the university website.

International students should make sure you get your application in well before the deadline, particularly if you want to study at one of the UK's top universities. Check individual university website course pages for details of how to apply.

You'll need to be aware of visa conditions, English language requirements and work permit restrictions.

UCAT ANZ for Medicine and Dentistry in 2023

The University Clinical Aptitude Test is a compulsory test that you may have to sit in order to apply for some degrees in the fields of Medicine or Dentistry. It is designed to help universities select applicants with the appropriate abilities and professional behaviours required to practice

successfully as a doctors or dentists. It is used in collaboration with other admissions processes, such as interviews and academic qualifications.

13 of the [universities](#) in Australia offering Medicine and Dentistry, and two in New Zealand, will require you to sit the UCAT ANZ test as part of your application. So, if you're thinking of applying to uni in 2023 for a degree in one of those fields, you should check the entry requirements as soon as possible to find out if taking the UCAT ANZ is necessary.

Registrations for concession and access schemes are open now. **Bookings open on 1 March 2022 and close on 17 May.** You'll sit the tests between 1 July and 12 August 2022. Results will be delivered to the universities in early September.

It costs \$305 to sit the test (\$199 concession fee, but you only have until 10 May to register for concession prices).
